

International Students

A Global Community

IUMW is a diverse international community of students from around the world. Students are welcomed to a friendly campus environment that is multicultural, multi-faith, with plenty of peer and staff support on hand whenever needed. IUMW is a popular destination for international students for many reasons; not least the ability to graduate with a UK degree in a country where living costs are considerably lower. We provide students with the opportunity for an exceptional education, along with valuable cultural and social experiences, that we believe transform our students into global citizens.



International Student Office

The International Student Office (ISO) serves all incoming and currently enrolled international students. The ISO provides specialist support to our international community of students, throughout the duration of their time at university. This includes student welfare and advice, student visas, medical insurance and any other matters related to international students.

Entry requirements

Our international recruitment team has the knowledge to provide specialist advice on entry requirements and applications for international students. They can provide specific information on the equivalencies of overseas qualifications, and will be able to confirm the comparable level of your qualification in relation to our entry requirements. They will guide you on all matters relating to your specific country to make your university application process as smooth as possible.

Student support

We understand that moving to another country to study can be challenging, as you are away from the familiarity of your home country. Student well-being is our priority, which is why staff at the Centre for Counselling and Psychological Services (CCPS) are on hand to offer support and guidance to international students to ease any issues or concerns they may have while they are away from home.

Arrival

Arriving in a new country for the first time can be overwhelming. To make it as easy as possible, we offer free airport pick up services to IUMW for all new international students arriving at the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA). A representative from the University will meet you at the Immigration checkpoint of KLIA to assist you.

Student visa support

All international students are required to hold a valid student visa, which we will apply for on your behalf. We can also assist international students in arranging visas for dependents such as a spouse or family member upon request; as well as renewing student visas, and any other related issues.

Medical insurance

Medical Insurance Coverage is compulsory and is arranged for international students by the International Student Office. Medical insurance coverage takes effect from the date you register as a student.

Opening a bank account

Many banks offer international student basic accounts with an ATM card/ Visa Debit Card. To open a bank account, you will need documentation from the University, your original passport and a minimum deposit (set by the respective bank). Your Visa should also be valid for a minimum of 6 months. If you are under 18 years old, you will also need an indemnity form signed by your parents and witnessed by the relevant authority from your home country.





RESEARCH PROPOSAL

Applicants for Doctor of Philosophy (Project Management) programme are required to submit a comprehensive statement of the research which they propose to carry out. The proposal should comprise the following elements:

- Field of research
- Topic of research proposal
- Background or a brief literature review on the research topic
- Objective of study - Explain the objectives that influence the research
- The Methodology of study - Explain the methods used in study such as library research, lab work, field work, etc
- Work schedule
- Equipment required (where applicable)
- Brief bibliography
- The research proposal should contain between 1,500 - 2,000 words or about four (4) pages




